
## President's Message

## REPORT On Our March Meeting

**MAJ Dan Gutierrez** served as Meeting Chair, as Col. Vecera was out of town on military business, and he did a fantastic job! He reported that efforts are underway for our October 28 meeting to be held in conjunction with MOWW (Military Order of World Wars) in the Ellington area. This is in keeping with a goal of reaching out to those who may find it easier to attend a meeting closer to them. But a strong voice expressed appreciation for BraeBurn Country Club and the belief that it is viewed to many as a centralized location.

Chairman Gutierrez announced that we need to fill a full table—or even two—at the Military Ball on May 20 (information in this newsletter). Please let LtCol Vecera know if you can attend so we can hold you a space.

Our speaker, **Col. Mark Campsey**, was outstanding! Again, for those of you who missed this meeting and hearing this speaker, we are sorry. You really missed a great treat. We thank him for taking his valuable time to speak to us, on the topic of "the Value of Sacrifice and Service in the War Against Terror Post-9/11."

He invited us to reflect on where we were and what we were doing on 9/11/01 and described the moments when the planes hit those buildings. The result of that awful day was 2,977 killed: 2,750 in the Twin Towers, of whom 343 were NYCFD, 23 were NYPD, and 27 were with the NYC Port Authority. The remaining casualties were at

the Pentagon and of those brave souls who took the plane down in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, to prevent a worse outcome. “War has always been a life-altering event,” Col Campsey said, “but this one is different,” as he outlined and expounded on three major differences.

(1) In the War on Terror, the warriors do not just serve and then come home. They deploy again and again, creating and renewing psychological stress not only on the warriors but on their families as well.

(2) Terrorists don’t wear uniforms. There are no front lines. Terrorists have no rules of combat and use our rules of humanity against us.

(3) IEDs. Terrorists are tremendously skilled with these lethal devices, and our warriors are always anticipating being struck by them.

In the War on Terror Post-9/11, during the 14 years through August 2016, 2.6 million have deployed, 700,000 of those multiple times; 400,000 are living with PTSD or some form of combat stress. An amazing statistic: 80% are proud of their service, and 89% would do it again. “We cannot let them feel that they are forgotten,” Campsey said, to the applause of all in attendance. “MOAA is a respected voice, and we hope you continue,” Campsey added.


**General Joy Stevens** was also at the meeting, and at the end of Col. Campsey’s talk, she added that she had served with Mark Campsey during his last deployment,

at which time his wife was dealing with breast cancer. His wife told him: “You Go! Your soldiers need you!” [There were not too many dry eyes in the place. –Ed.]

Col. Campsey concluded with: “Only ONE PERCENT of this country has ever been in uniform, so we must make use of every opportunity to remind others of the brutal nature of this war.

**COL James Stryker**, husband of General Stevens, was also at the meeting, and he reported on the status of the Texas War Memorial project. The design has been approved, the artist has begun, and the location will be on 12th Street at San Jacinto in Austin, where all who enter the capitol from that area will pass right by it, and it will be visible from both 12th Street and San Jacinto. They hope for a Veterans Day presentation. **Gen. Stevens and Col. Stryker** will be the speakers for our July meeting, so come one and all!

Treasurer **Don Couch** announced that the Board had voted to donate \$500 again this year for the UH Army ROTC Scholarship, and added that \$335 of this had been raised through the drawings at monthly meetings. At this meeting, **Lt. Lee Barratt** won the drawing and donated his winnings back to the treasury for the scholarship fund.

## NEWS OF INTEREST TO MILITARY VETERANS

*News you may not have heard from the mainstream and cable news:*

### **Trump Vet Listening Session**

President Trump held his first face-to-face meeting with representatives from prominent veterans groups on 17 MAR—a step that community advocates called a productive and critical step in advancing the White House’s promises to veterans. The hour-long meeting with Trump, Vice President Mike Pence, Veterans Affairs Secretary David Shulkin, and senior White House staff covered issues including medical care access for veterans, accountability for VA employees, veterans caregiver programs, and the President’s campaign pledges to make veterans services more efficient. President Trump was involved in the conversation throughout the meeting, questioning the groups on their priorities and ways the White House can help. “We’ve been asking for this meeting for a long time, and I think it was a great way to start a working relationship with this White House,” said Joe Chenelly, national executive director of AMVETS. “Both the President and Vice President were very engaged on the issues and wanted to hear from us.”

“Coming out of the meeting, we believe that the President and his administration are committed to improving the VA system of care and expanding choices for veterans seeking healthcare outside of the VA system,” Sherman Gillums Jr., Executive Director of Paralyzed Veterans of America, said after the meeting. “What’s more, we are optimistic that with further collaboration between his administration and Secretary Shulkin, there is a new day dawning for the future of all healthcare for veterans that

includes convenience, quality, and adequate protections.”

President Trump spoke briefly to press at the start of the meeting, saying that “as Commander in Chief, I will not accept substandard service for our great veterans,” and repeated his assertion that veterans have been treated poorly by VA in recent years. “I outlined a detailed plan to reforming veterans’ care throughout the country, and we’re working to put that plan into effect,” he said. “And it’s moving, I think I can say, honestly, ahead of schedule.”

Officials in the meeting said President Trump made no new promises to the groups, but did direct VP Pence to discuss the idea of a White House office for veteran empowerment after a suggestion from Got Your 6. Bill Rausch, Executive Director of that group, said he pushed for administration officials to look beyond Veterans Affairs programs and challenges to larger societal issues for ways to help veterans, noting that not every veterans issue is one tied to health care and benefits. Along with Got Your 6, the meeting included Student Veterans of America, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, and the “big six” veterans groups: American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, PVA, Vietnam Veterans of America, and AMVETS. In a statement, CVA Executive Director Mark Lucas praised President Trump for “a bold vision of VA reform that includes choice and accountability” and said his group is grateful that he “has given us a seat at the table in these important discussions.” At one point,

President Trump promised to quickly fire any VA employee found committing criminal acts or workplace negligence, and if it violates federal employment policies, “they can sue me, I don’t care.” Officials from Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America said they were disappointed to be left off the event. ### **DoD Fraud Waste & Abuse?**

If you have suggestions on how to save money on building the F-35 fleet, or on how to reorganize Veterans Affairs hospitals to be more efficient, President Trump wants to hear from you. An executive order signed by President Trump 13 MAR calls for a “comprehensive plan for reorganizing the executive branch” to include a plan from every federal department by early September to “improve the efficiency, effectiveness, and accountability of that agency.” In addition, the order calls for the director of the Office of Management and Budget to invite the public to suggest improvements to how federal agencies operate. That includes the Departments of Defense, Homeland Security, and Veterans Affairs (but not Congress, which is part of the legislative branch of government).

In a statement to reporters before his Cabinet officials, President Trump said the move is designed to make the federal government more efficient and effective.

“Today there is duplication and redundancy everywhere,” he said, without offering further specifics on areas where he has seen those problems. “Billions and billions of dollars are being wasted. This order requires a thorough examination of every executive department and agency to see where money is being wasted, how services can be improved, and whether programs are truly serving American citizens.” Candidate Trump made cutting government waste a frequent promise on the campaign trail.

Details on how the public can submit ideas will be published in the Federal Register ([www.federalregister.gov](http://www.federalregister.gov)) in coming days. The final report from OMB is expected to include whether some federal agency functions “would be better left to state or local governments, or to the private sector” and “the costs of shutting down or merging agencies.” In January 2015, the Pentagon’s Defense Business Board suggested the Defense Department could cut \$125 billion in spending over five years by reducing services from contractors, implementing early retirements, reworking contracts, and reducing administrative costs.

VA officials have also faced charges of wasteful spending in recent years, including expensive overruns on hospital constructions. [Source: *Military Times*, Leo Shane III, March 14, 2017.]

“Keeping the Promise,” “Fulfill Their Trust,” and “No One Left Behind” are several of many mottos that refer to the efforts of the Department of Defense to recover those who became missing while serving our nation. The number of Americans who remain missing from conflicts in this century are: World War II (73,515) Korean War (7,841), Cold War (126), Vietnam War (1,627), 1991 Gulf War (5), and Libya (1). More than 600 Defense Department men and women—both military and

civilian—work in organizations around the world as part of DoD’s personnel recovery and personnel accounting communities. They are all dedicated to the single mission of finding and bringing our missing personnel home.
