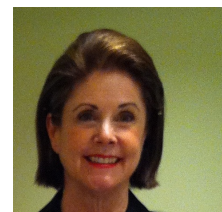



Report:
August 31 Speaker

Maj James Cunningham gave a very informative talk to us at the BraeBurn Country Cub on August 31. He is President of the Alamo Chapter in San Antonio and past-President of the Texas Council of Chapters, so he is very “up on” all things legislative.


He talked about the fine line between advocacy and lobbying. We are advocates, apolitical, working with all parties and factions for matters important to the military and their families. He updated us on bills passed in the 83rd Texas Legislature (85 bills concerning veterans were introduced, and 45 passed).

We should all be aware of the Hazelwood Act of 1919 that established 153 credit hours FREE for any veteran, and it is *still in effect!* Not only that, the Legacy Act of 2008 made unused hours available for the children of veterans.

The “Community Blueprint Program” was discussed, which is a program we as a chapter can partake in on the local level. We will be hearing more about in the future, so stay tuned.

And just to make sure you know, the Affordable Health Care Act (“Obamacare”) DOES NOT AFFECT TriCare in any way! But TriCare will certainly remain a topic at the top of all legislative lists in the future.

Remember: “Grass roots” works, and we should do our part every day!
